- <u>Q1</u>: Requesting information on what is required for naval reservists who have NCCCO(*) certification to obtain a Navy crane license?
- <u>Q2</u>: Is it required for them to attend General Crane Safety and rigging?
- <u>Q3</u>: My other question is what documentation do we need to establish a crane license record for them?

ANSWER

Q1: Naval reservists who possess current NCCCO operators certifications may be issued a Navy crane operators license at the discretion of the designated licensing official, for the types of cranes that the candidate holds current NCCCO certifications, provided the following conditions are met.

The operator candidate must:

Submit an application for a crane operator's license.

Submit a copy of his or her current DOT physical examination record.

(The physical examination is valid for two years.)

Submit a copy of the current NCCCO certifications for the cranes to be operated.

Successfully complete the NAVCRANECEN authorized 8 hour General Crane Safety Refresher course.

Successfully complete the performance test on each type of crane he or she is to be licensed on.

The crane operator's license shall be issued for a period of not to exceed two years.

- <u>Q2</u>: The NCCCO certified operator must at a minimum, successfully complete the 8-hour, General Crane Safety Refresher course, in lieu of the 40-hour, General Crane Safety course.
- <u>Q3</u>: The crane operator's license file shall include documentation as listed above in the response to question 1.
